Introductions

Project description –

- The City of Georgetown is updating their Sidewalk Master Plan with a major focus on their downtown area.
- This project is an update to 2001 Sidewalk Master Plan
- City manager wants to consider other plans, like the parks plan, in this effort
- City is working to achieve ADA compliance and is working on Transition Plan

Project schedule updates

Open houses begin in September

Current Conditions on TxDOT Facilities

 Bridges over IH 35 are designed to be wide enough to incorporate sidewalks but sidewalks do not currently connect to these facilities

Ongoing TxDOT Projects in Georgetown

 IH 35 Frontage Road and Ramp construction – some sidewalk facilities along frontage roads

Future TxDOT Projects in Georgetown

- IH 35 Mobility Planning Project is considering E/W pedestrian crossings. Ultimately the Corridor Plan should address north/south pedestrian facilities along the freeway and provide recommendations.
- FM 1460 (Quail Valley to south of Inner Loop) will have continuous sidewalk on both sides on the northern portion and on the west side on the southern portion —August letting

- SH 29 (Between IH 35 and Scenic) will have sidewalk on the south side
- City is working on application for STPMM funds for Austin Ave and FM 971

Opportunities for Joint Participation

- IH35 Southbound Frontage Road between Austin Avenue (SH 29) and Leander Road (FM 2243)
- Williams Dr & IH35 Southbound Frontage Road pedestrian ramps
- Leander Rd (FM 2243) GISD priority Tippit/ Pickett Elementary pedestrian ramp needs
- Austin Ave (SH 29) between Summercrest Blvd and Eastview High School

Other Considerations

- The City Development Code requires sidewalks as adjacent land parcels are developed—developer responsibility
- City requires TxDOT approvals for each project in TxDOT right-of-way (Municipal Maintenance Agreements)

Funding for TxDOT Sidewalks and Pedestrian Facilities

- TxDOT sidewalk funds are typically allocated from CAMPO
- ADA Compliance funds are used to help TxDOT comply with Transition Plan and are used for pedestrian ramp upgrades and small pieces of sidewalks.
 - o Generally these funds are allocated every 2-3 years
 - Generally spread throughout district
 - There is a current needs assessment underway in which sidewalks in the City of Georgetown could be incorporated.
- MAP 21 replaced the Safe Routes to School Program

Tasks

- City of Georgetown to provide TxDOT with their currently identified pedestrian facility needs to be considered in current TxDOT ADA funding evaluation
- HDR to request crash data for the City of Georgetown
- HDR to obtain Transition Plan from TxDOT
